

## WELCOME ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT, LOYOLA COLLEGE IBADAN OLD BOYS' ASSOCIATION TO THE 71ST ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



The members of the Board of Trustees, both current and incoming, the immediate past president, invited guests and fellow Loyolans.

It is with deep gratitude and great joy that I welcome you to this year's Annual General meeting of Loyola College Ibadan Old Boys' Association. Whether you are here in person, joining virtually or reading this address on your device from across the world, you are part of a brotherhood bound by shared history, enduring values and a love for our Alma Mater.

### Reflecting on 71 Years of Excellence

Seventy-one years ago, a visionary dream took root — the dream of building an institution that would not only provide academic excellence, but also shape young boys into responsible men of character, leadership, and service.

Today, we celebrate that dream.

We remember the founding missionaries, past principals, teachers, and all those who have laboured in the vineyard of Loyola College Ibadan. Their legacy lives on—not just in our buildings or traditions, but in the lives and achievements of Loyola men across the world.

Today, we gather not only to review our Association's progress, but also to reaffirm our commitment to the ideals that Loyola College has instilled in us, in discipline, integrity, service, and the pursuit of excellence. “Loyola, the best in every way” - remains, not just our motto, but our compass.

### What We've Done, What We're Building

I would like to take this opportunity to highlight some significant milestones that we have achieved in the past year, thanks to the collective effort and commitment of our members.

One of the major milestones has been the renovation of the Akeredolu Hall as previously promised. All the toilets attached to the Hall are now fully functional, all windows secured with locks, doors repaired, the suspended ceiling has been restored, and a number of the lights and wall sockets fixed. The renovation of the Hall not only preserves the integrity of the property but also positions the Hall as a revenue-generating asset. The income derived from its use will support its ongoing maintenance and contribute additional income for the Association.

Another significant milestone was the creation and launch of LOCOBA website, a project that has been in the pipeline for several years. We now have a fully functional digital platform that enables Loyolans across the globe to stay informed about Association and School activities. You can connect to the website on [www.locoba.org](http://www.locoba.org). The website also serves as a hub for networking and offers a space for members to showcase their businesses to a wider audience.

A few weeks ago, precisely on Saturday, the 2nd of August, we re-launched the Lagos Branch of the Loyola College Ibadan Old Boys' Association with Brother Dipo Okunubi as the Interim Chairman. The relaunch and resuscitation of the Lagos Branch is expected to contribute significantly to the growth of the Association and provide a veritable platform to reach out to many Loyolans in Lagos and secure their support in one form or the other towards the accomplishment of our objectives.

The issue of returning Loyola College to the Catholic Mission or the Old Boys' Association in partnership with the Catholic Mission remains a deeply important and urgent matter. We strongly believe that the

return of the School is the most effective way to restore the School's academic and moral excellence reminiscent of its golden years. Regrettably, progress in discussions with the Oyo State government has been slow.

Nevertheless, we remain undeterred. With the continued support of the Board of Trustees, we are committed to a sustained engagement with the Oyo State Government on this issue. In the meantime, we will not allow the delay in the return of the School to hinder us from implementing the lofty ideas that we have for uplifting the School, both in terms of infrastructure and human capital development. The National Executive Committee, together with the relevant Standing Committees, will continue to explore creative ways to improve standards in the School in terms of infrastructure, academic excellence, nurturing moral integrity and advancing sports development.

The National Executive Committee is deeply committed to supporting the long-term growth and stability of Loyola College. In that light, I am pleased to share that we have launched a major initiative: the ₦750 million Endowment Fund. This is not just a financial campaign—it is a bold statement of belief in the enduring value of Loyola.

This fund will empower us to:

1. Rehabilitate and upgrade school infrastructure, including classrooms, laboratories, libraries, the main School building and the School fence.
2. Renovate, upgrade and equip Akeredolu Hall.
3. Promote human capacity development through scholarships, staff training, workshops, and mentorship program
4. Support sports development by upgrading sports facilities, organizing competitions, and providing training opportunities for students and coaches.
5. Support the construction and development of an Alumni Building

We had a mini-rollout at the Founder's Day Lecture in Lagos, and I will like to invite you all to be part of this initiative—by making a contribution or a pledge and helping us connect with others who can.

### A Call to Action

My dear brothers, our strength lies in unity. No contribution is too small, no effort insignificant. Whether you give your time, your expertise or your resources, you help build a legacy that will outlive us all. As our Guest Speaker, Mr. Fela Durotoye stated at the Founder's Day lecture, “our greatness as Loyolans is inextricably tied to the greatness of the School”. The challenges are significant, but with all of us working together, we can overcome the obstacles and take our Alma Mater to greater heights. In the words of the Japanese poet and writer Ryunosuke Satoro, “individually, we are one drop. Together, we are an ocean”.

I invite each of you to commit, in your own way, to the advancement of our School and our Association.

This is a moment for us as Loyolans to join hands together to realise our collective dreams for our Alma mater. It is also a time to invest in something greater than ourselves.

## REPORT OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL



Protocol

Mr. President, Board of Trustees Members present, Members of the LOCOBA Executive Council, indefatigable LOCOBA Executive Committee members, Esteemed Set and Branch Chairmen, Distinguished Old Boys, friends of the College.

I stand before you today with gratitude and duty, to present the Secretary General's Report at this auspicious 71st Annual General Meeting of our great Association' LOCOBA. The past year has been marked by steady progress, renewed commitment, and a shared passion to uphold the legacy of excellence that Loyola College represents.

### 1. Administrative Activities

#### a. The Executive Committee

Throughout the year, the Executive Committee held regular meetings' both physical and virtual to deliberate on matters affecting the Association. All minutes of our meetings were diligently recorded and circulated. Correspondence with the school authority was maintained, and the Association has continued to offer itself as a responsible stakeholder in Loyola College's affairs.

A major administrative milestone of this Executive was the renovation of the Akeredolu Hall as promised by the President as one of his cardinal electioneering campaign points. Our sitting here comfortably this morning for our A.G.M is a testament to this good work. All the toilets attached to the Hall are now functional, all windows secured with locks, doors repaired, the Suspended Ceiling fixed and some of the lights and wall sockets fixed.

Another landslide achievement of the Executives was the hosting of the LOCOBA website a project that has been in the pipeline for years back. With this we are able to start the process of updating our membership database, project the activities of the Association globally and also keep members well informed about upcoming programmes of the Association. The hosting of the Website has also helped in improving coordination with Set and Branch executives.

Also, the Executive Committee was able to reconstruct the collapsed perimeter fence of the College (behind Akeredolu Hall) and also provided two points of drinkable water for the Students close to Akeredolu Hall in order to reduce the rate at which students go out of the School premises in search of drinkable water.

The Executive Committee also facilitated the April Get Together of our Elders at Akeredolu Hall which was put together by a planning Committee under the Chairmanship of Bro. Gbenga Ogunojemite. The event was well attended and was a big success.

It is also of note to mention that through the efforts of the Executive Committee we now have the Lagos Branch as an addition to the Branches we have in the Association. The Branch was inaugurated on the 2nd of August with Bro. Dipo Okunnubi as the Interim Chairman.

The Executive Committee also paid a courtesy visit to the Permanent Secretary of the Teaching Service Commission was also visited in order to promote cordial and harmonious relationship between the Association and those regulating activities of the School.

Finally, the Executive Committee was able to make a visual representation of the Proposed Alumni Building in order to promote the commencement and execution of this project.

#### b. The Executive Council

The Executive Council met as expected and considered issues relating to the possible takeover of the School in conjunction with the Catholic Mission, establishment of the ownership of the Buildings and land in the School, review of our annual dues, expansion of the membership of the Board of Trustees, 750 million Endowment Fund for LOCOBA.

All the Committees set up worked and were functional during the period under review

### 2. Membership Engagement

We witnessed encouraging participation across various platforms. Notably, the 1961, 1974, 1977, 75/76, 1980, 1981, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1993, 1994, 1996, 2000 and 2005 sets showed remarkable initiative in driving their set activities and contributing to national projects so also are the following branches; Ibadan, UK/Ireland & America/Canada . Other sets, however, remain less active, and we intend to increase follow-up and engagement with them going forward.

The LOCOBA WhatsApp Forum and social media pages remain lively, and have served as vital tools for bonding, information sharing, and mobilization.

### 3. LOCOBA Projects and School Support

In line with our mission to give back to our alma mater, several impactful interventions were carried out this year:

1. Payment of 40 indigent Students SSCE fees
2. Donation of 10,200 copies of exercise books and textbooks by 2000 set
3. Donation of Basketball materials worth millions of naira to the School Basketball team by Pastor Tola Odutola
4. Sponsorship of the School's inter-house sporting competition
5. Donation of 20 modern classroom chairs made by the Adeyemo family in memory their late Bro Wole Adeyemo.
6. Provision of drinkable water points in (close to Akeredolu Hall) the School by the Executive Committee
7. Educational intervention by a group of friends based in the United States of America led by Prof. Babafemi Taiwo in the area of Mathematics and Physics, other members of the group include: Prof Rasheed Balogun, Mr Olaolu Akande, Dr Gbenga Famoyin, Dr. Dimeji Akiode, Mr Wale Ogunmodede
8. Employment of a Guidance Counsellor for the Junior school by the 1984 Set

### 4. New Principal

Following the voluntary retirement of the former principal of the School in person of Bro Olufemi Moradeyo (a Loyolan), a new principal has been posted to the school and has resumed work. The new Principal is Mr. John Ayedun.

### 5. Security

The three security guards we inherited from the past administration are still working in the school. I am happy to inform you all that since November last year LOCOBA has taken the responsibility of payment of two of the guards that were being paid by Ibadan Branch. These guards are now working together with the two employed by the State government.

### 6. Sporting Activities

To the glory of God, the college continued her giant stride in the area of sporting activities by successfully hosting their inter-house sporting competition which was jointly hosted by the Junior and the Senior Schools. Also, the Schools football did well this year and basketball teams continue to win laurels for the school by coming 4th in the milo secondary school basketball, 1st position at the Ilaji secondary school basketball competition, defeated ISI both home and away and successfully hosted Loyola college basketball development tournament

### 7. Obituaries

Within the year under review, it saddens my heart to report that we lost that the Secretariat was informed of the demise of three Loyolans in person of Bro. Yinka Alakija 71 set, Bro Olugbenga Albert Fagbure 79 set, Bro. Ariyo Olusegun 83 set & Bro. Olatunji Temitope Oginni 2000 set. May their souls continue to rest in the bosom of the Lord. Amen.

### 8. Challenges

Despite our progress, a few areas remain concerning:

- a. Inconsistent financial contributions from some sets
- b. Limited participation in general LOCOBA activities by a few groups
- c. Delayed responses to circulars and official communications

We are actively working to address these issues through improved tracking, regular reminders, and dialogue with the affected sets.

### 9. Appreciation

On behalf of the Secretariat, I express profound appreciation to the President, the entire Executive Committee, the Executive Council, all Committee Chairmen, and especially the Branch & Set Chairmen for their consistent support. I also recognize the efforts of our members in diaspora who have continued to identify with LOCOBA's cause from afar.

### Conclusion

Let us renew our commitment to unity, discipline, and service. The strength of LOCOBA lies not in our numbers alone, but in the values we uphold and the legacy we preserve. May our efforts continue to bear fruit for Loyola College Ibadan and for generations of students to come.

## REPORTS OF ACTIVITIES IN JUNIOR SCHOOL 2024/2025 ACADEMIC SESSION

It is a great honour to give the reports of the activities that took place within the just concluded academic year as the Principal of the School (Junior).

The session commenced with the Stake Holders, meeting which came up on the 13th of September, 2024. In attendance were the Catholic Priest, Rev. Fr Kehinde Idowu, all the newly elected officers of LOCOBA National led by the President Mr Gbenga Biobaku, Parents Forum Chairmen of both Schools, and Principals of the School. The program was simultaneously followed by the Pre-Resumption Seminar on the 16th of September, 2024. The convener was a group of Old Students based in London tagged 'LOYOLA INCORPORATE', one of the fascillators was Alhaji H.A. Lawal (Permanent Secretary) TESCO, Head office Ibadan.

The school finally resumed on the 17th of September, 2024 with thirty-two (32) Teaching staff and two non-teaching staff.

### 1. ACTIVITIES

The following were the activities that took place in the school.

Valedictory service for JSS 3 students, class of 2023/2024 came up on Tuesday 8th of October, 2024.

Joint Prize Giving Day was held on Wednesday 9th October, 2024. It was sponsored by the UK/IRELAND Old Boys Association.

Carol Service was held, on Wednesday 19th of December, 2024. The presence of Father Christmas added glamour to the day. Present at the occasion were the Catholic Priest, Alumni Officer and representatives of the Local Inspector of Education (L.I.E.)

The State Government in the bid to improve the level of education in the state posted newly recruited six (6) Teachers and Non-Academic staff to the school in January, 2025. The school management took a bold step to organize an Induction program for the new appointees in order to integrate them into the system on the 20th of January, 2025.

A leadership program tagged iChoose'- 'iLead' preparing the next generation leaders was inaugurated on the 23rd of January, 2025. The program embraced 300 Junior students. Some of the values it highlights are; Choice, Growth, Commitment, Self-worth, Teachability, Responsibility and Resilience. All the students were given manuals by Sadi-Nigeria (Convener). The program is progressing.

## 2. SPORTS

Year 2025 Interhouse Sports Competition took place on Friday 4th of April, 2025. Yellow house- St Cyprian came 1st, St Anthony (Red house) came 2nd, St Cyril (Green) came 3rd, while the 4th position was bagged by the Blue house- St Augustine respectively. A Lagos based company 'Mano' added glamour to the day, as they served their Glucose product of different flavors to the students and guests. Seventeen (17) schools were on ground for the invited relay race.

The school's team were at Lekan Salami Sports Complex in commemoration of year 2025 World Children's Day for match past on the 27th of May.

In compliance with the government directive, we observed World Cultural Day. Some of the activities were; Cultural dance, Fashion parade, Poetry and Recitations.

A student represented the school in the Mathematics Association of Nigerian (MAN) Competition, he came 1st and 4th in the First and Second stages of the competition.

Valedictory service was organized for the out-going JSS 3 students', on completion of their Basic Secondary School which featured 342 students; transiting to the Senior School. The students wore their Sash with the logo of Loyola for the ceremony, on the 30th of July, 2025. The transition class was named 'Rising Stars'.

## 3. DONATIONS

i. In commemoration of the 25th anniversary of the year 2000 set, they presented over 1000 students with six (6) copies of big notes each. They also funded the school library with some copies of relevant Textbooks.

ii. An Old Boy donated ten (10) School Bags to indigent boys.

iii. The Grandfather program fully sponsored by ten (10) members of the 1983 set has been funding (10) boys with daily cash for mid-day meal and transportation

iv. The '83 set also donated two thousand (2000) copies of plastic ID cards which is meant to be worn on daily basis on completion of the printing.

v. Bro. F. Abidogun presented a literature textbook and cash award of N10,000 to the best JSS 3 student in English Studies.

vi. Some members of the 1988 set in diaspora gave the face of the Admin. and JSS 1 blocks a new look by painting both blocks. They did a welcome-back package for forty (40) indigent students at the beginning of the session. The package included; School Bag, Sandals, Socks, Customised notebooks, writing materials, Water bottles, Belt, to mention a few. They have put in place measures of follow-up with feedback of their terminal reports. The set was so magnanimous enough with the repairs of 150 students' lockers and chairs as well as major repairs on the ceiling of two blocks of the Junior school.

As regards the welfare of the guards, we met with the Contractor that brought them and issues raised by the guards have been resolved.

The School's new Principal is really cooperating with the Committee in the area of Security.





### [a] Introduction

Loyola College Ibadan [LCI] Old Boys' Association for the Class of 1983 runs a fraternity that comprises members of the Graduating Class of 1983. This fraternity comprises of those who graduated from LCI in 1983 but the fraternity is also open to those who sat for their West African Examination Council certifications in June 1983 at LCI as re-takers or external candidates. Both groups have many Boys who collaborate as 1983 Set Members of LOCOBA.

The first group has 354 members; including notables such as a former Chairman of the Lagos State Chamber of Commerce, [Bro. Akin ADENIYI]; a foremost Human Resources expert, [Bro. Yemi FASEUN]; a foremost doctor in the London UK metropolitan area [Bro. Leye SANU]; and a former Minister of the Federal Republic, [Bro. Remi BABALOLA].

The second group has 343 members; including notables such as a former 3-time member of the House of Representatives of the Federal Republic, [Bro. Festus Adewale ADEGOKE]; a current Governor of the Federal Republic, [Bro. Jide Sanwo-Olu]; and a foremost Oyo State politician based in Ibadan North LGA, [Bro. Olatunji Haastrup Adewale].

The 1983 Set runs several affiliated programmes centrally managed by an Executive Committee [EXCO1983] that is elected every 24 months to fill eight [8] positions.

1. Chairman - Adekunle Adebisi
2. Vice-Chairman - Ibikunle Fadahunsi
3. General Secretary - Kunle Kehinde (Acting)
4. Financial Secretary - Kayode Omisore
5. Welfare Secretary - Adeyemi Abiona
6. Treasurer - Kunle Kehinde
7. Public Relations Officer
8. Social Secretary - Ayodeji Smith

The main programme managed by the EXCO is the LOCOBA 1983 Set Association WhatsApp Group. Currently, that platform has 101 members. All of the 101 participate in at least one of the Association's activities which include financial contributions, programmes, projects, Committee assignments and welfare schemes. A Monthly General Meeting [MGM] holds on the WhatsApp Platform.

### [b] LOCOBA 1983 Association Committees

The LOCOBA 1983 Set Association EXCO manages operations with the aid of Committees:

1. Electoral Committee. The Electoral Committee is the Standing Committee in charge of all elections matters of the Association.
2. Projects and Programmes Committee. The Projects and Programmes Committee is the Standing Committee that will supervise all activities of the Association that relate to events, constructions, repairs, maintenance or disposal of physical assets that the Association deploys as part of the Association's aims to "improve the standards and reputation of the college in all ramifications."

3. Welfare Committee. The Welfare Committee is the Standing Committee in charge of managing all standardized Welfare activities of the Association. This Committee operates via a written Guideline that is approved by the House and subject to review from time to time.

4. Audit Committee. The Audit Committee is the Standing Committee with a main function to ensure that policies, actions and programmes of the Association do not infringe-on or negate policies, actions and programmes of LOCOBA National, or the LOCOBA Constitution or the Association's Constitution.

5. The Well-being and Wellness Committee. A Special Purpose Vehicle Standing Committee that monitors the health, social and financial status of all members for the primary purpose of identifying situations when empathic or monetary aid is needed to forestall or reverse negative situations that directly impact members. The Committee operates mainly through its wellness and Checkup Care Center, [WC3].

6. Ad-hoc Committees. These are time-bound teams commissioned to result temporary problems or provided special solutions. These include the Constitutional Amendment Committee, [in charge of periodic updates to the Association's guiding principles]; and the MediAid Committee, [in charge of sourcing long term funds for use by Association].

### [c] Main Accomplishments LOCOBA 1983 Association Committees for 2025 Anniversary Year Ending

1. Projects and Programmes Committee. For the Anniversary Year Ending 2025, the major accomplishment with a direct impact on the Alma Mater as a whole was the construction of a First Aid Room to serve as a primary healthcare point for Staff and Students. Several minor but effective accomplishments are also to be noted, such as: [i] LOCOBA 1983 spearheaded the provision of academic material for the 2024/2025 Academic Session by supplying the first collection of Board Markers to suffice for the Senior School for the First Term of the session' across all subjects in the Senior School; [ii] LOCOBA 1983 supported June-2024 WAEC Fees payments for some boys and November-2024 NECO fees for 6 boys of which 5 passed with results that were used to facilitate their admissions via the JAMB-2025 examinations; [iii] LOCOBA 1983 successfully deployed a Daily Financial Aid Programme for 10 boys in the Junior School at 500Naira per Boy per School Day.

2. Welfare Committee. For the Anniversary Year Ending 2025, LOCOBA 1983 successfully took on a number of applications for Business-aid which included over 400,000-Naira worth of Equipment and Materials.

3. Audit Committee. For the Anniversary Year Ending 2025, the Audit Committee diligently reviewed contractor and artisan quotations resulting in savings of over 300,000 Naira. This was made possible by the Association's "hands-on" management style that relies on using in-house expertise and experience to manage the deployment of constructions and the executions of purchases.

4. The Well-being and Wellness Committee. The Committee oversees the most important aspects of LOCOBA 1983 activities; to wit, being Brothers' Keepers. For the Anniversary Year Ending 2025, the Committee, along other adhoc Welfare Teams, successfully deployed 10,341,000.00 Naira as cash for direct welfare benefits to Brothers in Jan-Nov 2024; 2,754,000.00 naira in December-2024; and over 300,000.00 Naira in 2025 up to June-2025. [That is a total of over 13-million Naira for the the Anniversary Year Ending 2025. None of the funds were derived from the statutory fees and fines paid into the Association accounts. All of the funding by this committee and its associate committees were donations outside the statutory sources of funds.] The deployed aid was for situations that included one major surgery, one extensive anti-prostate-cancer treatment and one major recovering-care from severe traumatic and bone damage resulting from a grave vehicular accident.

5. Ad-hoc Committees. For the Anniversary Year Ending 2025, one of the ad-hoc committees has acquired and delivered 8.4-million Naira worth of smartcards to be used to produce ID Cards for pupils in the Junior School. This initiative is a direct response to parents and non-State actors to help reduce Delinquency and Teenage-crime in Oyo State.

**[d] LOCOBA 1983 Set: Plans for Deployed within the next Anniversary Year**

1. Expansion of the Daily Financial Aid programme to at least 40 more pupils. This is based on the definite reports of success of the Pilot Run; and the documented requested for such assistance for over 160 indigent pupils in the Junior School and reported counts of scores in the Senior School.

**Set Membership**

Total known membership is about 128; how ever only 41 are financial members with just 25 being up to date as at now. Financial membership has increased from about 10 to 41 since this executives came into once. This is due to the membership welfare and school intervention activities of the set which this executive has spearheaded.

**1. Giving Back to the School**

- Employment of Night Guard for the Junior School: The 1979/1984 set employed a Night Guard for Loyola College Junior School since August 2024 and has been paying his salary promptly since then. This has helped to stem the hitherto frequent incidents of burglary in the school.
- Employment of Guidance and Counseling Tutor: The set also employed a Counselor for the Junior school and has been responsible for her salaries since August 2024. This was in response to the high level of antisocial behavior among the JS students. Our last review of this intervention indicated a significant reduction of truancy, use of hard substances, petty theft and other antisocial behaviour among the JS students

**2. Meetings and reunions Via Enlightenment**

The Set also organized lecture series which are held virtually every other month. The lecture series are themed as Veritas 84 Enlightenment Lecture Series and included the following lectures:

1. Cardiac Health which deals with issues such as high B.P, Stroke and Diabetes
2. Prostrate Health which deals with issues affecting the prostrate and erectile dysfunction
3. Cyber security which deals with how to keep our identities, finance, and information safe online.
4. Retire in Wealth lectures which will deal with how to invest and manage our finances.

The Lecture Series Offered the Opportunity to meet and reunite as a set every other month and to also learn and share ideas together under the leadership of the executive implemented the following projects in the school.

**3. Welfare: a few of the welfare activities of the set in the year are listed below:**

- Helped to raise funds fora member dealing with hemiplegia
- Remembering and publicly celebrating the birthdays of members across the set's social media platforms
- Helping to announce and publicize Special Occasions of members across the Set's Social Media Platforms.
- Leading and encouraging the attendance of such special occasions by as many members as possible

**4. Support to the Association**

- Payment of our annual dues to LOCOBA promptly
- Donation of N265, 000 to Locoba Towards the School's Inter- House Competition

**5. Challenges**

The major challenge was with being able to run the Set' Bank account.
